

As announced at last year's Annual Parish Meeting, we are about to go ahead with new gateways at the entrances to Hurstpierpoint and Sayers Common. These will signal the arrival into our communities, that drivers and others are entering 'our place', and we hope that they will have a moderating effect on traffic speeds.

The locations are:

Cuckfield Road, Albourne Road,
Wickham Hill, Malthouse Lane
and Brighton Road in
Hurstpierpoint,
and
London Road (south and north),
and Reeds Lane in Sayers Common.

Over the next few months we will be planning our expenditure for 2019 and beyond. We would like to have your thoughts on what should be our priorities.

Your Parish Council spends money on a wide range of services for our villages including maintaining streetlights, public toilets and some waste collection services. We look after the cemetery, South Avenue and Reeds Lane recreation grounds, bus shelters, allotments and the Hurstpierpoint Village garden. We also give grants to local organisations to help them provide services to residents.

Over the last few years we have completed some major projects establishing the 50 acre Hurst Meadows parkland as a major amenity for residents, replacing nearly 120 streetlights and implementing a new state of the art play area in South Avenue.

Current plans include working with MSDC to refurbish the clubhouse facilities at Court Buses - which we will manage as a centre for community activities, improving play areas in Sayers Common and installing village gateways in Hurstpierpoint and Sayers Common. We are working on the design of cycle paths and 'quiet lanes', and working with WSCC to improve traffic flow in the Cuckfield Road. We also plan to establish Hurstpierpoint as a 'Dementia Aware' village including setting up a respite centre for sufferers and carers.

Our day to day services and some projects are funded by your council tax of £1.31 per week for a Band D home.
